

Family Literacy Day® is a national awareness initiative created by ABC Life Literacy Canada in 1999 and held annually on **January 27** to raise awareness of the importance of reading and engaging in other literacy-related activities as a family. **January 27**, 2019 is the 20th Anniversary of Family Literacy Day!

New Activities for 2019!

- I wonder why? Go online as a family and learn something new. Ever wonder why the ocean and sky are blue?
- **Read ANYTHING!** A book, blog, magazine or letter from grandma. Read together and get in your 20 minutes each day
- Be a Rockstar: Sing along with the radio or do Karaoke maybe a duet?
- Make something yummy: Follow a family recipe or create a new one together.
- **Travel the world:** Your library card is your passport to travel the world and to take a learning journey.



- Scientist in the House: Do a kitchen experiment or mix up a batch of playdough.
- It goes something like this: Tell your favourite story and give it a new ending, or take turns making up a new story.
- **Crafty Crafter:** Paper, glue, yarn, paint so many things to create! Do a craft together.
- **Stepper challenge:** Go for a walk and count your steps. How many steps to school, the park, your friend's house?
- Deal me in: Play cards and keeping score is a fun way to practice counting.
- **Tell it to me:** Tell someone about your day at dinnertime or pick-up the phone for a chat. What was the best part?
- **Shopper Time:** Make a grocery list together with kids finding what's on the list and checking off the items (and maybe adding one special treat!)
- I'm on Staycation: A vacation at home can be lots of fun. Plan a trip in your neighbourhood.
- **Riddle me This:** Tell jokes and riddles while doing chores around the house can you stump your parents?

Weekly Skating for WPS Students

Students at Whitney Public School are excited to skate each week at the Whitney Community Rink in town as part of their phys. ed. program for the winter.



Our junior students will skate every other Wednesday afternoon, providing we have enough parent volunteers on those days to help, and our Senior students will skate from every Thursday afternoon. As always, you must have a Vulnerable Sector Check to volunteer with students. Please be aware that our insurance requires that YOU wear a CSA approved helmet to skate.

The students will be walking to and from the rink, weather permitting. Students MUST wear a CSA approved helmet with cages. If your child does not have a helmet, the school will provide them. Please let us know as soon as possible, if your child/ren will need to borrow a helmet.

Winter use of playgrounds present a greater risk to students. Frozen ground does not provide a protective surface for falls. OSBIE has been a long-time advocate of playground safety programs that include, but are not limited to, the provisions of the CSA Standard CSA-Z614-98, and any preceding Guidelines.

It continues to be RCDSB practice that our playground remains closed to RCDSB students through the winter months.

Our playground structure has recently been inspected, and the determination has been made that it is safe for use, only for students age 5 and older. We will be addressing options for our younger students, as we prepare to open the playground in the spring.

For safety and efficiency reasons, Renfrew County District School Board would like to reduce the amount of Cash & Checks coming into our school. Please join the thousands of parents who have already registered and are enjoying the convenience of paying ONLINE! It takes less than 5 minutes to register. Please follow these step-by-step instructions, so you will begin to receive email notifications regarding upcoming events involving your child(ren).

NOTE: If you require assistance, select the GET HELP option in the top right hand corner of the screen.

Step 1: Register

- a) If you have not registered, please go to the School Cash Online home page <u>https://rcdsb.schoolcashonline.com/</u> and select the "Get Started Today" option.
- b) Complete each of the three Registration Steps
 - *For Security Reasons your password, requires <u>8 characters</u>, Of those 8 characters you need, one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter and a number.

Step 2: Confirmation Email

A registration confirmation email will be forwarded to you. Click on the link provided inside the email to confirm your email and School Cash Online account.

The confirmation link will open the School Cash Online site prompting you to sign into your account. Use your email address and password just created with your account.

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Step 3: Find Student

- Note: Student Number is Not Required
- This step will connect your children to your account.
- a) Enter the School Board Name
- b) Enter the School Name
- c) Enter Your Child's Name & Birth Date
- d) Select Continue
- e) On the next page confirm that you are related to the child, check in the Agree box and select Continue
- f) Your child has been added to your account

Step 4: View Items or Add Another Student

If you have more children, select "Add Another Student" option and repeat the steps above. 5 children can be added to one parent account.

If you do not wish to add additional children, select "View Items For Students" option. A listing of available items for

purchase will be displayed.

French Immersion

The RCDSB is expanding it's French language programming. Beginning in September 2019, families will be able to access additional french language instruction in the Amprior, Renfrew and Pembroke family of schools. Head to the RCDSB website, to find out more details about how the programming will be rolled out, and what it means for your child.

There are two ways to register your child for kindergarten.

Online Registration

To register your child for JK/SK for September 2019 use our online system anytime by visiting

<u>http://www.rcdsb.on.ca/en/parents/registration-and-transfers.asp</u>. Please be sure to complete the School Based Extended Day Program Family Survey that is at the end of the online registration if you are interested in a licensed child care program. You will receive a confirmation email after submitting your online registration.

In Person

Visit the school for a registration package between 9:30 a.m and 3:00 p.m. on Monday, January 21 to Friday, February 1, 2019. If you are interested in a licensed child care before and after program, complete the School Based Extended Day Program Family Survey online at <u>https://goo.gl/yJg6rA</u>.

Both registration methods require you to bring the following documents to your school. If you have questions about the registration process, contact the elementary school nearest you.

Required Documentation (bring to the school):

- Completed, signed and dated registration form (access the form online, complete it and bring it to school)
- Proof of address (Utility bill or proof of ownership/ tenancy)
- Proof of student's birth date (birth certificate, passport, birth registration, citizenship card or statement of live birth)
- Child's immunization records (Students entering from outside Renfrew County should contact Renfrew County and District Health Unit at 613 735-8666.)
- Proof of custody where applicable (custody orders, court ordered Guardianship)
- Immigration documents where applicable

Voluntary Early Years Experiences Data Collection

Included in the registration process will be an additional voluntary survey through which the Ministry collects information from families about the experiences of children in child care and early years programs in Ontario. This information will help the government understand how families access programs and services in their communities and better define how the early years experiences influence children's outcomes.

Extended Day Program for Children between Ages of 3 - 12

The Renfrew County District School Board and your school may be offering a School Based Extended Day Program for students (from JK up to age 12) starting September 2019. This School Based Extended Day Program will operate within the school by an Early Childhood Educator before and after school and is meant to complement the regular day program.

The School Based Extended Day Program is contingent on enrolment and is funded from parent fees. Subsidies may be available from the County of Renfrew <u>http://www.countyofrenfrew.on.ca/_documents/childcare/FeeSubsidyApplicationForm.pdf</u>.

The School Based Extended Day Program Family Survey form can be completed from the Online Registration portal if you are new to RCDSB and completing the online registration form or from the Google Survey link <u>https://goo.gl/yJg6rA</u>, at the Board's website <u>http://www.rcdsb.on.ca</u> select the Extended Day Program page from the Programs drop down menu.
