





A Relationship-Based Approach to Student Well-Being and Achievement.

This month we will be exploring **Regulation** with our students and staff.



"Regulation is the ability to respond to and recover from stress. Stress is a normal part of life and learning. Regulation, also referred to as self-regulation, is the ability to successfully manage the emotional, psychological, and physical impact of stress" (Dr. David Tranter, <u>The Third Path</u>, 2018, p. 66).

At school, we will be teaching students the signs and symptoms of dysregulation along with strategies to better manage their stress. We know that students often don't recognize the stress that they feel. We want to help help build a toolbox of strategies to help them deal with stress.

Reminder Our Family Lending Library is ready!

Based on surveys that were sent out to all parents last spring, the parent council compiled a list of resources that could benefit families in the following areas of interest:

Anxiety, ADD/ADHD, building relationships, bullying, character traits, math, literacy, mindfulness, mental health, parenting, and so many more!

We have attached a list of books and critical thinking games to this newsletter that are available to borrow for two weeks at a time. Feel free to request to borrow a resource through your child's agenda and we will send it home with them for the next two weeks, or feel free to pop into the school and take a look at the resources for yourself anytime.


