

"Wait, how do you draw clean"?








#### Math About Me!

All milk orders must be placed through School Cash Online this year.

For safety and efficiency reasons, Renfrew County District School Board would like to reduce the amount of Cash & Checks coming into our school. Please join the thousands of parents who have already registered and are enjoying the convenience of paving ONLINE! It takes less than 5 minutes to register. Please follow these step-by-step instructions, so you will begin to receive email notifications regarding upcoming events involving your child(ren).

NOTE: If you require assistance, select the GET HELP option in the top right hand corner of the screen.

#### Step 1: Register

- a) If you have not registered, please go to the School Cosh Online home page https://rcdsb.schoolcashonline.com/ and select the "Get Started Today" option.
- b) Complete each of the three Registration Steps
   \*For Security Reasons your password, requires <u>8 characters</u>, Of those 8 characters you need , one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter and a number.

#### Step 2: Confirmation Email

A registration confirmation email will be forwarded to you. Click on the link provided inside the email to confirm your email and School Cash Online account.

The confirmation link will open the School Cash Online site prompting you to sign into your account. Use your email address and password just created with your account.

#### Step 3: Find Student

Note: Student Number is Not Required

This step will connect your children to your account.

- a) Enter the School Board Name
- b) Enter the School Name c) Enter Your Child's Name & Birth Date
- e) On the next page confirm that you are related to the child, check
- in the Agree box and select Continue Your child has been added to your account

#### Step 4: View Items or Add Another Student

If you have more children, select "Add Another Student" option and repeat the steps above. 5 children can be added to one parent

If you do not wish to add additional children, select View Items For Students" option. A listing of available items for purchase will be displayed.

# **WHAT DO I DO IF I HAVE ANY COVID-19 SYMPTOMS?**

UPDATED Guidance on Testing and Isolation. Sep 22, 2020

# SYMPTOMATIC PERSON



## HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS

1.

The person with symptoms must self-isolate AND get tested.

2.

The person with symptoms can go back to school/work when they receive a negative test result

AND

it has been 24 hours since symptoms started improving

AND

they have **not had a fever** (without medication) for 24 hours. 1.

Household members

must self-monitor for any symptoms but do not need testing if they do not have symptoms.

2.

Household members can continue to attend school and work with careful attention to physical distancing, masking and hand-washing rules.



Minor symptoms known to persist in children (i.e. runny nose) should not keep the child away from school, so long as a negative test result has been received AND it has been 24 hours since symptoms started improving AND they have not had a fever (without medication) for 24 hours.



If a person with symptoms does not get tested, they must self-isolate for 14 days from the onset of symptoms.



A doctor's note IS NOT required for return to work/school, once the above criteria have been met.

**KEEPING YOU SAFE** 

## <u>REMINDER</u>

The process for online learning will be a combination of live online instruction along with assignments and activities. Students participating in online learning are expected to be available and present for all scheduled instructional times and complete all assignments. Grades (1 to 12) will be required to complete 225 minutes of learning per day. Kindergarten will be 180 minutes.

Academic expectations for students learning from home will be no different than those learning in the classroom. Online learners will still have access to mental health and special education supports as needed.

The RCDSB would like to highlight for parents/guardians that students who enter online learning will not be in the same class, or with the same teacher, as they would be at their regular school with in-person learning.

In order for the District and our staff to deliver online education, students learning from home will be part of an online classroom, with other online students in their grade or multiple grades from schools across the District. Each classroom will be assigned an online teacher.

Parents/guardians will have the opportunity at four separate times throughout the school year to switch their children from remote learning to in-person learning, or vise versa. Dates are as follows:

#### **Elementary**

Parents/Guardians must commit by: Effective on:

Aug. 17th Sept. 8th

Nov. 2nd Nov. 16th

Jan. 18th Feb. 2nd

March 29th Apr. 12th
