### Family Literacy Day - Wednesday, Jan. 27th

Family Literacy Day, held annually on January 27, was developed by ABC Life Literacy Canada in 1999 to celebrate adults and children reading and learning together, and to encourage Canadian families to spend at least 15 minutes a day enjoying a learning activity together.

### 2021 Theme - Travel the World Together!

#### Here are some ideas:

- 1. Go online Research a country that interests you on the internet with your family.** Find out things like the language they speak, their currency, and popular food, music and sports
- 2. Flags of the world.** Look up colourful flags from different countries and try drawing them together.
- 3. Ciao!** Teach your family how to say hello and goodbye in different languages.
- 4. Greetings from abroad!** Imagine you're on a vacation and write a postcard to a friend or family member. Describe the weather, what it's like and what activities you're doing
- 5. Map the world.** Look at a blank world map and try to name each continent and ocean. For more of a challenge, try identifying countries or even cities.
- 6. Family vacation.** Research your next family vacation online together, even if you don't have one planned. Look up how much it will cost to travel there, hotels and activities, and put together a budget for your trip.
- 7. Get cookin'!** Find a recipe for a popular international dish, such as butter chicken or paella. Follow the recipe together as a family and enjoy the meal you've cooked.
- 8. Family history.** Research your family's history and culture. Learn about your family traditions (how about starting a new one!)
- 9. Sounds of the world.** Go to YouTube as a family and play some popular songs from other countries. Dance and move to different tunes and hum along, trying to guess what the lyrics mean.
- 10. A to Z** Test your family's geographic knowledge by trying to name a country for every letter of the alphabet. Hint: there is one for every letter except X.

## School Cash (Ordering items online)

We are hoping to have ALL parents and guardians at WPS register with School Cash to make ordering items at school easy! Please call the office if you'd like some help to register or you can follow the instructions we have attached below.



For safety and efficiency reasons, Renfrew County District School Board would like to reduce the amount of Cash & Checks coming into our school. Please join the thousands of parents who have already registered and are enjoying the convenience of paying ONLINE! It takes less than 5 minutes to register. Please follow these step-by-step instructions, so you will begin to receive email notifications regarding upcoming events involving your child(ren).

**NOTE:** If you require assistance, select the **GET HELP** option in the top right hand corner of the screen.

### Step 1: Register

- If you have not registered, please go to the School Cash Online home page <https://rcdsb.schoolcashonline.com/> and select the "Get Started Today" option.
- Complete each of the three Registration Steps  
\*For Security Reasons your password, requires **8 characters**.  
Of those 8 characters you need , one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter and a number.

### Step 2: Confirmation Email

A registration confirmation email will be forwarded to you. Click on the link provided inside the email to confirm your email and School Cash Online account.  
The confirmation link will open the School Cash Online site prompting you to sign into your account. Use your email address and password just created with your account.

### Step 3: Find Student

**Note: Student Number is Not Required**

This step will connect your children to your account.

- Enter the School Board Name
- Enter the School Name
- Enter Your Child's Name & Birth Date
- Select Continue
- On the next page confirm that you are related to the child, check in the Agree box and select Continue
- Your child has been added to your account

### Step 4: View Items or Add Another Student

If you have more children, select "Add Another Student" option and repeat the steps above. 5 children can be added to one parent account.

If you do not wish to add additional children, select "View Items For Students" option. A listing of available items for purchase will be displayed.

### Online Registration

To register your child for JK/SK for September 2021 use our online system anytime by visiting

If you are interested in a licensed child care program, please be sure to complete the School-Based Extended Day Program Family Survey at the end of the online registration!

### In-Person

In person registration may not be available for 2021 due to COVID-19 protocols. Please contact the elementary school nearest you for specific arrangements.

Both registration methods require you to bring the following documents to your school. If you have questions about the registration process, contact the elementary school nearest you.

### **Required Documentation (Bring to school at a time designated by the school in accordance with COVID-19 protocols):**

- Completed, signed and dated registration form (access the form online, complete it and bring it to school)
- Proof of address (home phone/cable/internet bill) or proof of tenancy/ownership (Ontario Property Assessment Notice or lease agreement or property tax bill)
- Proof of student's age (birth certificate, registration of birth card or passport)
- Student's immunizations records. [Immunization Questionnaire](#) (this form must be printed & filled out in ink)
- Proof of custody where applicable (custody orders, court ordered Guardianship)
- Immigration documents where applicable

### Extended Day/Before and After Program for Children between Ages of 3 - 12

In an effort to better understand parent interest and determine the viability of establishing Before and After care at sites across the District, we are asking you to declare whether you would enroll your child in a School-Based Extended Day/Before and After Program for students from Junior Kindergarten up to age 12.

School-Based Extended Day/Before and After Programs operate within the school by an Early Childhood Educator with options for before and after school care and are meant to complement regular school day programming. They are contingent on enrolment and are funded from parent fees. Subsidies may be available from the County of Renfrew <http://www.countyofrenfrew.on.ca/documents/childcare/FeeSubsidyApplicationForm.pdf>.

The School-Based Extended Day Program Family Survey form can be completed from the *Online Registration portal* if you are new to RCDSB and completing the online registration form or from the *Google Survey link* <https://forms.gle/yYSmL5ZTuoJSAc2r7> at the *Board's website* <http://www.rcdsb.on.ca> select the *Extended Day/Before and After Program* page from the *Programs* drop down menu.
